Key features of good assessment

- **Purpose**

Every assessment should have clear objectives

- **Fairness and Inclusivity**

Provides equal opportunities and is unbiased

- **Validity of Assessment**

Assessment measures what it intends to evaluate

- **Reliability of Assessment**

Assessment produces consistent results

- **Value**

Produces meaningful insights (Learner and Educator)

Benefits of good assessment



- Monitoring of Learners progress and allows focus on their strengths and weaknesses
- Broadens people's knowledge which helps improve the competence of the individual and the organisation
- Understanding their progress can lead to further motivation to learn – assessment for learning and continuous learning
- Organisational learning which positively impacts the culture and goes beyond the individual
- This, in turn, can lead to fewer accidents and cases of ill health, an improved environment with greater levels of wellbeing. Ultimately saves lives.

Reference the scenario where required



Separating each answer/response e.g. bullet point
